

CG WK 11 The Whole Story God Our Rescuer

Read Together: Exodus 3:1-15; Exodus 12:21-28

Recap:

Exodus is about God rescuing His people from slavery.

- Moses points us to Jesus (the deliverer).
- Egypt represents sin and bondage.
- Pharaoh represents Satan, holding us captive.
- Passover lamb points to Jesus, the Lamb of God, whose blood saves us.

Discussion & Application

1. God Calls Us Out of Slavery (Exodus 3:7-9)

- God saw His people's suffering and came to rescue them.
- He sees us in our sin and calls us out of it.

Questions:

- 1. Where have you experienced God calling you out of a place of bondage or sin?
- 2. How does it help you to know that God sees and hears you in your struggles?
- 3. What "Egypt" (old habits, sins, ways of thinking) is God calling you to leave behind today?

2. God Reveals Who He Is (Exodus 3:10–15)

- Moses said, "Who am I?" God answered, "I AM."
- God's presence and power—not our ability—are what matter.

Ouestions:

- 1. When have you felt like Moses—unqualified or inadequate?
- 2. How does knowing "I AM is with you" change the way you look at God's calling on your life?
- 3. What is one "next step" of obedience God may be asking you to take right now?

3. God Sets Us Free to Worship (Exodus 7:16)

- God didn't just rescue Israel from Egypt; He rescued them for Himself—to worship.
- Worship is reverence, response, surrender, and lifestyle.

Questions:

- 1. How do you personally express worship to God outside of Sunday mornings?
- 2. What's one area of your life where God is asking you to show His worth more clearly?
- 3. Why do you think Satan works so hard to keep people from truly worshiping?

4. God Saves Through the Blood of the Lamb (Exodus 12)

• The Passover lamb's blood saved God's people.

• Jesus, the Lamb of God, saves us by His blood on the cross.

It's not enough to know about the Lamb; the blood has to be applied.

Questions:

• What does it mean for you personally that Jesus is your Passover Lamb?

Why is it not enough to just "know about" Jesus?

 How would you explain the importance of the blood of Jesus to someone new in the faith?

Where is God calling you to trust Him like Moses did?

What "Egypt" do you need to leave behind this week?

Who can you share the story of the Lamb with before next Sunday?
